Standardized Testing - October 15

Due to standardized testing on October 15, each grade level will have a specific schedule for the day:

- Freshman will have ASPIRE testing all day regular school hours
- Sophomores will be participating in a retreat all day regular school hours
- Juniors will take the PSAT test in the morning. They will be released at the end of the morning testing.
- Seniors have no school all day they are encouraged to use the day to work on college applications.

Look for more details to arrive (via email) from SHS this week.

Parent Teacher Conferences - October 16 & 17

Parent Teacher conferences will be held on Thursday, October 16 from 12:30 to 8:00 pm (school will be dismissed at 11:30) and on Friday, October 17 from 8:00 – 11:30 am (no school that day). Unlike other district schools, no

appointments are necessary. When you arrive you will see teachers seated at desks, and you may make your way from teacher to teacher in which ever order you choose. (Don't forget to bring a list of your child's teachers with you!) In order to avoid long lines building up, please keep your conference time to about 5 minutes. If you need more time with any teacher(s) you may schedule separate conferences with them. Note that Friday is usually less crowded (i.e. shorter lines) than Thursday, and that evening hours tend to be the most crowded.

Congratulations to SHS Senior Augustus (Gus) Pendleton, on being named a semifinalist in the 2015 National Merit Scholarship Program. Over 1.5 million students entered the National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the PSAT in the 2013-14 school year, and only 16,000 (less than 1% of U.S. high school seniors) advanced to become semifinalists. Also, some colleges (by no means all) take "demonstrated interest" into account during the admissions process. These meetings are just one of many ways that as student can demonstrate interest in a school.
