A Note from the Editor

In my former life, I was an accountant, which makes me a numbers gal. I like numbers and I like data. I loved my college statistics class. (Go ahead and chuckle – I'm used to it.) So it should come as no surprise when I say that I look forward to seeing the results of the risk behavior survey that SHS students took last year. Not because I like studying the numbers in and of themselves, but because the data helps remind me to keep my eyes open, to keep my head out of the sand, and to continue to have conversations with my children about many of these risky behaviors. And admittedly, it also satisfies a curiosity as to what it might actually mean when I hear one of those "everyone" or "no one" phrases that teens seem to use so often.

Next Monday evening, October 15, the data from last year's survey will be presented at the Parent Association's second parent forum of the year. The data will no doubt be interesting not just to numbers gals like me, but to non-numbers folks as well. However, the more important part of the evening will be the moderated discussion about healthy parental responses to the risk behaviors that teens sometimes engage in or are exposed to. <u>Please join us for this important presentation and discussion</u>.

As I said in last week's note, even really good kids will occasionally make mistakes. It's part of growing up, it's part of having a less than fully developed brain. But that doesn't mean we should encourage risky behavior or look the other way when it happens or may happen. This forum will help us all to learn some of what is happening with our teens, and how we can best respond to it. Growing up is not an easy job, nor is the job of parenting the ones who are in the midst of growing up. Thank you to Sue Kelley and Kim Apflebach for planning these forums to help us all with the job of parenting teens.

Join the SHS Parent Association and the SHS Administration for a presentation and discussion about data gathered from the 2011 Youth Risk Behavior Survey which was taken by SHS students last year. This survey addressed

- Alcohol, Drug and Tobacco Use
- Depression and Suicide
- Sexual Behavior
- Bullying, Personal Safety and Weapons Use
- Physical Activity, Eating Habits
- Driving and Traffic Safety

Juniors & Seniors – Sign Up to Meet with College Representatives

Junior and Senior Students are welcome to meet with college representatives that visit SHS.
