Forms, Documents & More

- <u>Transcript Release Form</u> This form must be completed and signed before Student Support Services can send transcripts to colleges or other institutions. Note that if the student is under 18, it must be signed by a parent or guardian.
- <u>Family Connection Information</u> Read this important document which includes college application procedures. Some specific information to note:
 - To have a transcript sent to a college(s) the student must:
 - Have a Transcript Release Form on file
 - Add a request for each college via family Connections (procedure included in the linked document)
 - Submit a paper copy and a \$3 processing fee for each school to which a transcript is to be sent.
 - Teacher Recommendations
 - Students must approach teachers IN PERSON to request letters be written.
 - After receiving consent from a teacher, students may then use Family Connection to send them the form and additional information.
 - Additional Family Connections and College application Information can be found at http://www.shsparentassn.com/documents.html.
- <u>Student Brag Sheet</u> Counselors use this form when writing college recommendations for students. Each student should complete one and turn it in during their senior year. (Feel free to type, rather than handwrite, for the word version go to http://www.shsparentassn.com/documents.html, and look in the "college planning" section.) Underclassmen may want to start keeping a list of their activities for themselves, so that when they complete their brag sheet during their senior year, they can more easily recall activities from their underclassmen years.
- <u>Scholarship List</u> Use this document to see a list of scholarship search engines, as well as a list of select local and national scholarships.

Seniors - College Application Process

During the extended homeroom last week, Seniors were given a packet about the college application process. <u>To see an online version, click here</u>. This document includes:

- A senior year timeline
- · A list of scholarship search engines
- A list of local and national scholarships
- Family Connections
 - Use it to inform your guidance counselor of which colleges you are applying to
 - Request a teacher recommendation
 - Request that transcripts be sent to colleges to which you are applying
 - Use it to research specific colleges

Student Directories

There are about 50 of you who paid for student directories, but have not yet picked them up. If you are one of those people – you or your student can stop in the SHS office and get yours. If you didn't preorder – directories are still available for sale, also in the SHS office.

Using Family Connection to Determine when College Representatives are Visiting SHS

- All juniors and seniors are welcome to meet with these representatives.
- Students must have a signed pass from the guidance office 24 hours in advance.
- To see which schools are sending representatives on which days,
 - Use Family Connection http://connection.naviance.com/shorewood
 - The first time you use this site you will need to input the code you were given by student support services, you will then create a password, and use that for subsequent visits. If you do not have your code from student support services, you can expect to receive a paper copy this week.
 - Click on the colleges tab
 - There is a section labeled "Upcoming College Visits"
 - You can see the scheduled visits for the next few days
 - Click on "view all upcoming college visits" to see future weeks
 - Expect this to be updated frequently as more colleges schedule visits to SHS.
- Attending these sessions, not only allows a student to learn more about a specific college, it also allows them to show "demonstrated interest" in that college – something that some (not all) schools consider in the admissions process.
- Note there is LOTS more that you can do with Family Connection if you haven't spent any time looking around the site yet, be sure to do so. And keep in mind, that the SHS specific data is still being updated.
