Message from Mr. Kenney

Dear SHS Families,

It is hard to believe that our Fall Sports Season is almost over! This is a very exciting time at SHS as many of our teams continue to excel and travel deep into post-regular season competitions.

The final home football game is on Friday (October 17) night. As previously mentioned, I indicated that I would communicate any changes to our school events and I want to take this opportunity to mention a couple things in this note.

Our basic expectation for fan attendance is that spectators will sit in the stands. While we exceeded bleacher capacity at the Homecoming Game, we already know that this will not be nearly as big a crowd and there will be plenty of room. Hopefully, Shorewood fans will heavily outnumber the competition! Students will no longer be allowed to loiter behind or at the sides of the stands and we have bolstered our event staff to ensure that behavioral expectations are met and that everyone in attendance can enjoy the game.

We are also expecting spectators to remain inside the stadium area. If anyone decides to leave the stadium area (designated by the location of the ticket booths), they will not be allowed to return and they will be expected to leave the Shorewood High School campus. This is for safety purposes and these ideas were developed in conjunction with the

Shorewood Police and a lot of the feedback that I received from parents and community members in attendance at the Homecoming Game.

Thank you for reading this note, and I hope to see you at the final home game!

Flu Vaccines Available for Students - October 28

The North Shore Health Department has a limited number of flu vaccinations available for students aged 18 years and younger. It will be available on a first come, first served basis to Shorewood High School students and will be given on October 28th at the North Shore Health Department Shorewood office (2010 E. Shorewood Blvd) between 3:15 and 4:30 pm. This is injectable preservative free quadrivalent (covers four strains of influenza) vaccine and the cost will be \$10.00 per vaccine for this limited supply only. You must call 414-371-2980 to reserve a dose of this vaccine and the student must bring a signed consent form and \$10.00 to the clinic to receive the vaccine. Only students who have reserved a vaccine dose will be able to receive one. Please call the North Shore Health Department at 414-371-2980 if you have any questions.
