A Note from the Editor

([An edited version of the letter can be found here.](#)) I'll add my two cents, from a parent's perspective:

As you many of you know, one of my favorite parts of working on the bulletin is collecting all the items for the "congratulations and kudos" section. Our children, collectively are a pretty neat group of kids. But what you see celebrated in the bulletin is just the tip of the iceberg. I'm convinced that SHS is full of great kids who don't always get recognized, but nonetheless are hard working, productive students who are caring, thoughtful and good decision makers. But, if you've been a parent for any length of time, you know that even the best of kids can and will make mistakes from time to time.

One of our jobs as parents is to help our kids make good decisions. And from what I can tell, kids are less likely to make poor decisions, if they know someone is paying attention. So, my plea/advice to you is to confirm your child's plans on homecoming weekend (and at other times too). Talk to other parents; know there will be an adult present where teens are gathering before and after the supervised portion of homecoming. But most importantly, make sure your child knows that you are paying attention. No matter what they tell you – you are NOT the only parent who is confirming plans and talking to other adults. And the more of us that do this, the easier it is for each of us to do it. Let's work together - not against our kids - but for our kids!

The *Room to Breathe* movie screening originally scheduled for September 21st, has been rescheduled for Wednesday, October 2nd at 6:35 p.m. in the Shorewood High School Auditorium. Explore, PLAN and PSAT Testing – October 16th

Standardized testing will take place during the morning of Wednesday, October 16. **Freshmen** will take the Explore test, **Sophomores** will take the PLAN and **Juniors** will take the PSAT/NMSQT. Seniors will begin the school day at 11:56 and are encouraged to use their free morning to work on college applications.

Students should be seated by 7:35 am, so those who do not normally have a first hour period will need to set their alarms a bit earlier. Additional information can be found in an alert now email and a letter that will be mailed home this week.

Parent Teacher Conferences – October 10 & 11

Parent Teacher Conferences will be held on October 10 from 12:30 pm to 8:00 pm (school will be dismissed at 11:30) and on October 11 from 8:00 am to 11:30 am (no school that day). Unlike other district schools, no appointments are necessary. When you arrive you will see teachers seated at desks, and you may make your way from teacher to teacher in which ever order you choose. (Don't forget to bring a list of your child's teachers with you!) In order to avoid long lines building up, please keep your conference time to about 5 minutes. If you need more time with any teacher(s) you may schedule separate conferences with them. Note that Friday is usually less crowded (i.e. shorter lines) than Thursday, and the evening hours tend to be the most crowded.

SHS Best Buddies to hold Trip Fundraisers

Shorewood High School's Best Buddies organization will be hosting two fundraisers in October to help raise costs for the group's trip to Hawaii this spring. Best Buddies is an organization that creates opportunities for one-to-one friendships for people with intellectual and development disabilities.

The first fundraiser will be held on **Thursday, October 10th at Culver's in Shorewood**. As part of the event, the restaurant will be donating 10 percent of the proceeds from the entire day to the SHS Best Buddies Trip.

Also **beginning October 10th, individuals can recycle any cell phones, smart phones, inkjet cartridges (no toner), laptop computers, iPads, iPods and digital cameras** that are no longer used by placing the items in collection bins at the District's schools. National Merit Scholarship Semi Finalists and Commended Students Announced

Congratulations to the SHS seniors who have been recognized for their achievement on the PSAT/NMSQT test they took last year:

SHS Semi Finalists in the 2014 National Merit Scholarship Competition are Haley Florsheim, Emilie Lozier, Anjana Murali, Charlies Stahl and Daniel Whittle.

SHS Commended Students are Gregory Rubinshteyn, Hannah Miller, Laura Gould and Signe Bedi.

Semifinalists are determined based on 2012 PSAT/NMSQT. The 16,000 students nationwide who achieve semi-finalist status represent about 1% of the test takers. These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 8,300 National Merit scholarships. About 90% of the semifinalists will attain finalist standing, and more than half will win the Merit Scholar® title.

About 34,000 Commended Students throughout the nation have been recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2013 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students were among the top test takers of the 2012 PSAT/NMSQT.
