School District Annual Meeting - A Note from a District Parent

Some observations for those of you who missed the School Board Annual Meeting last week:

- There was a report from maintenance, which did a huge amount of work including greening our buildings, used some creativity to find efficient ways to do repairs and save money without jeopardizing safety or using crappy materials, and went \$150,000 under budget. We're saving \$80,000 in energy costs annually compared to a few years ago and the maintenance folks have even more ideas on greening the buildings and facilities.
- Mr. Stranke, SIS principal figured out a way to save on special ed transportation costs.
- It looks like the headcount will show another rise in enrollment this year which helps us with state funding.
- Superintendent McCann read off some impressive gains for African American kids between 4th and 8th grade, showing that the schools are making serious inroads into closing the achievement gap for these kids.
- Many in attendance felt that there was much evidence showing the work our district is doing to save money while still providing excellent services in our schools. And it would seem that young families are noticing too.

Using Family Connection to Determine when College Representatives are Visiting SHS

- All juniors and seniors are welcome to meet with these representatives.
- Students must have a signed pass from the guidance office 24 hours in advance.
- To see which schools are sending representatives on which days,
 - Use Family Connection http://connection.naviance.com/shorewood
 - The first time you use this site you will need to input the code you were given by student support services, you will then create a password, and use that for subsequent visits. If you do not have your code from student support services, you can expect to receive a paper copy this week.
 - Click on the colleges tab
 - There is a section labeled "Upcoming College Visits"
 - You can see the scheduled visits for the next few days
 - Click on "view all upcoming college visits" to see future weeks
 - Expect this to be updated frequently as more colleges schedule visits to SHS.
- Attending these sessions, not only allows a student to learn more about a specific college, it also allows them to show "demonstrated interest" in that college – something that some (not all) schools consider in the admissions process.
- Note there is LOTS more that you can do with Family Connection if you haven't spent any time looking around the site yet, be sure to do so. And keep in mind, that the SHS specific data is still being updated.
