A Note from the Editor

The note this week is mostly "housekeeping" stuff, but please read it as it is important if you want to receive information in a timely manner.

When I began sending this newsletter over 4 years ago, SHS did not have the capability to send mass emails to parents. If something urgent or exciting came up that they wanted to share quickly, they would contact me to see if I could send a bulletin for them. More often than not, I could, but once in a while information was not delivered timely. (I'm a volunteer, and believe it or not, I do not have access to my computer 24/7.) They now have their own email delivery system, but it seems that there are still parents whose emails are missing or incorrect. Some of what they send is just "nice to know" information, but often it's important and time sensitive.

If your email address is not included in the school's database, then you have missed the following, just in the past week:

- <u>District October Newsletter</u> including information about additional technology, engineering and arts programs that are being discussed; a budget update; various happenings in district schools and more.
- <u>SHS Parent Newsletter</u> from SCHOOL (not this newsletter, which you are obviously receiving!) which includes a note from Tim Kenney, information about conferences, and more!
- Suicide Prevention Training which is open to all adults

You can find almost all of the information you are missing by going to the district website (www.shorewoodschools.org) and clicking on various pages and links. And you can also find much of it in this weekly bulletin. But in order to receive it timely, without hunting for it, you will want to have it delivered directly to your inbox. SHS is trying to go more and more green, and therefore intends to use snail mail less and less. Use powerschool to make sure the school and the district have your correct email address:

Log into powerschool (https://shorewood.powerschool.com/public/) using your PARENT login (not your child's). On the left hand side, click on "email notification" and make sure that your email address(es) are entered and correct.

As you know, I often repeat information from the school here, but as I said, it will not always be timely. And I do include some information here that the school does not send – so you'll want both databases to have the correct email information.

Parent Teacher Conferences - October 10 & 11

Parent Teacher Conferences will be held on October 10 from 12:30 pm to 8:00 pm (school will be dismissed at 11:30) and on October 11 from 8:00 am to 11:30 am (no school that day). Unlike other district schools, no appointments are necessary. When you arrive you will see teachers seated at desks, and you may make your way from teacher to teacher in which ever order you choose. (Don't forget to bring a list of your child's teachers with you!) In order to avoid long lines building up, please keep your conference time to about 5 minutes. If you need more time with any teacher(s) you may schedule separate conferences with them. Note that Friday is usually less crowded (i.e. shorter lines) than Thursday, and the evening hours tend to be the most crowded. To see a list of which teachers will only be available at certain times, and when specific teachers will take dinner breaks refer to the Newsletter you received (hopefully) via email from school yesterday.

Suicide Prevention Training

The Shorewood School District and the Village of Shorewood will be hosting a Question Persuade and Refer (QPR) training for parents and community members on October 14. During the training, attendees will learn to become a gatekeeper, or someone in a position to recognize a crisis and the warning signs that someone may be contemplating suicide. The simple program teaches ordinary citizens how to recognize a mental health emergency, and teaches them how to get a person at risk the help they need. Because suicides happen in families---where emergency interventions are more likely to take place---the QPR Institute believes that at least one person per family unit should be trained in QPR. SHS Best Buddies to hold Trip Fundraisers
