From SAFE (Shorewood Action for Education) – Senator Darling Meeting with School Board – March 1

Faced with a \$137 million budget shortfall this year – and a \$3.6 **billion** gap in the next 2-year budget – Gov. Walker and the state legislature will be making difficult cuts. School aid is approx. 40% of the state budget and will certainly be affected.

Sen. Alberta Darling, co-chair of the Joint Committee on Finance, will have a big say in how the budget is balanced. Come hear a discussion between Sen. Darling and the Shorewood School Board on Tuesday, March 1 at 7 p.m. in the SHS Library. We do not yet know if Sen. Darling will be taking public comments and questions. If there's something important you want asked, please let your school board know.

This program if for females in high school through adult who want to learn how to keep themselves safe and is ideal for a mother and daughter, a group of friends or to take by yourself. The assault prevention program "STRATEGIC WAPP (Women's AssaultPrevention Programming)" will focus on building self confidence through teaching effective striking techniques, should a physical response be necessary. In addition, "STRATEGIC WAPP" focuses on teaching conflict communication skills, and analysis and proactive planning. "STRATEGIC WAPP" will keep you safe through assault prevention planning.
