# WKCE Expectations Adopted for Math and Reading

In the School District of Shorewood and across the state of Wisconsin, we are working to ensure that our students are ready for further education and careers. Our state assessment has been changing to reflect this priority.

In the next couple of months, Wisconsin public schools will receive the results of the Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Examinations (WKCE) that students in Grades 3 through 8 and 10 took this fall. This year, Wisconsin raised the WKCE scores needed for students to reach the basic, proficient, and advanced performance levels in reading and math. Because of these changes, WKCE results will show a significant decline in the number of students considered to be "proficient" or "advanced."

This does <u>not</u> reflect a change in the abilities of students, teachers, or schools. It only reflects the higher standards and aspirations we have for our students and schools. For more detailed information on the changes to WKCE Testing, please click here.

# **AP Exam Registration – February 19-25**

During AP courses this week, students received an AP Bulletin Booklet and an SHS Registration form and letter.

If a students plan to take AP Exams this spring they need to return the registration form and payment in full by 3:30 February 25th. Cash or check payment (made out to Shorewood High School) is is due to the Student Support Office between February 19 and February 25. Students who have the appropriate paperwork filed with SHS for Free and Reduced lunch are eligible for a fee reduction.

It is not expected that all students in AP courses take the AP exams. Please consult the AP Bulletin provided in class, or available in the Student Support office to help you determine if taking the exam is right for you. # Youth Options - Applications Due March 1

Students who exhaust the course offerings in a given subject in high school are eligible to take a class at a local college/university at the cost of the district (see the Department of Public Instruction's website for more details: <a href="http://youthoptions.dpi.wi.gov/">http://youthoptions.dpi.wi.gov/</a>.) Your student is not required to take a college course, but the option is available.

The deadline to enroll in the Youth Options program for next fall is March 1st, which is coming soon! Your child may already be aware of this, but he/she is responsible for completing the Youth Options application forms and indicating what course(s) he/she would like to take next fall. Most commonly, courses are taken at UWM because of the proximity to SHS. Students will need to look at the university's course offerings and indicate the course number(s) they are interested in taking. The application is available here.
