Note from Mr. Kenney

On Tuesday, February 24th, the Shorewood School Board officially approved a <u>change in the daily bell schedule for the</u> <u>2015-16 school year</u>, along with the district calendar for 2015-16. In the approved calendar, you will see all of the days where students are not in session but when teachers are working along with Winter Break, Spring Break, etc. Work will move forward to construct a more specific calendar related to school events and PTO events in the near future. The 2015-16 calendar approval is simply the framework for the school year.

I received a lot of feedback from parents, students, teachers and administrators related to changing the bell schedule. Parents were concerned that lunch would be diminished to an unreasonable amount and that the school year

would be extend past the normal conclusion. In both cases, we were able to avoid these things from happening, and I can assure you that I have a building full of happy teenagers with regard to sleeping later next year!"
