Note from the Editor

While I do keep a file of what I've written in the past, I try not to recycle these notes from year to year. A few exceptions to that rule are due to positive feedback and/or popular demand – and the “pre-prom note” falls into that category. So... some of you have heard this one before, but some of you haven't, here it is for those that want to read or re-read.

A few years ago, when Jonathan and I returned home from chaperoning post-prom at sometime after 2:00 am, we saw several emergency vehicles all with flashing lights going, right at OUR corner. Talk about sinking hearts. Turns out – it was a young man, not a teen, not prom related – but apparently DUI, who had sideswiped our neighbors' tree then travelled well onto their impeccably manicured lawn. Luckily they have a large lot (by Shorewood standards), or the car would have been through the picture window! The next morning there were car parts strewn throughout the yard – nuts, bolts, glass, pieces of metal, etc – it was not a “little” accident. The driver must have been wearing his seat belt, because he was taken away with only an ankle injury. Even though it wasn't a prom related incident, it felt like a “close call”. And with this year's prom just a few days away, and memories of this “close call” on my mind, I feel compelled to get on my soap box again, and remind you of the parenting tips you already know. I'm thinking of prom as I write this, but obviously these tips apply to any time our teens are out and about.

If your child will be attending prom, please make sure you've read the [letter that was mailed home](#) regarding the logistics and timing of prom and post prom. Prom should be a memorable and SAFE evening for our teens. Help them to stay safe by making sure you know their plans for both before and after prom. They're good kids, and while any kid can make a mistake once (and most will) - they are less likely to do so when they know we are paying attention. Remind your kids to drive safely, (including not texting – EVER – while driving), to wear their seatbelts, to require their passengers to wear seatbelts, to refrain from distracting the driver if they are a passenger and to call you if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe – at ANY time during this or any other evening. Yeah... they'll roll their eyes at you, but deep down, they're listening. Network with other parents to ensure that all activities are being properly chaperoned. And keep in mind one of my favorite expressions for parents of teens - “trust but verify”.

That being said, if your child is attending prom – enjoy the moment, as you'll no doubt be thinking about how quickly they've grown from adorable infants to fine young adults.

Grade Point Averages – Clarification re. Colleges

Previous emails included a link as to [how to calculate semester and cumulative GPA's](#). Please note, that if you are comparing your child's GPA to those reported by various colleges' data about admitted students – colleges often recalculate GPA's. Those that adjust the gpa from what is shown on the high school transcript may omit certain classes, or they may omit all or part of freshman year grades, they may ignore weighted grades and recalculate all classes as though they are on a 4.0 scale, or they may assign a higher weight to certain classes or to junior year classes. The formula that SHS uses is the one that will appear on your child's transcript that is sent to colleges, but may or may not be what the college considers the gpa to be when comparing them to other applicants.

The Miracle League of Milwaukee and the YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee are partners in a new program to give kids ages 4-19 with physical or cognitive challenges the opportunity to play baseball on the only universally-accessible baseball diamond in the Milwaukee area. The program is recruiting players and volunteers for the inaugural season this summer. Volunteers, aka Miracle League Buddies, range from age 12 and up who assist players on the field (batting, running bases, fielding, building social relationships, stealing bases, etc.). Buddies are assigned a player with special needs for the entire season after an orientation meeting about expectations and regulations. The eight week season runs from June 9th to August 4th (Opening Day thru Season Celebration). Games will be played on Tuesday or Thursday evenings at 5:30 p.m. or 7:00 p.m. at the John C. Cudahy YMCA Field on Swan Road. Summer Athletic Opportunities from the Recreation Department

The Shorewood Recreation Department will be offering the following this summer

- Fastpitch (Girls) Softball teams that will play at least 15 games both in Shorewood and in around the North Shore. Practices will begin mid to late may and the season will go until the end of July. (Ages 10-14) Also, there is a Fastpitch Clinic for grades 3-8.
- Youth Basketball Summer League for grades 5-9. Starting this summer, the Shorewood Basketball Association (SBA) will be under the supervision of the Shorewood Recreation Department. These summer basketball leagues are being run as a feeder program to further prepare our youth for basketball when entering high school.
