PARENTS OF JUNIORS, you should have received an email from Mandy Kluck, Student Support Services Chairperson, regarding teacher letters of recommendation for college. Some things to note:

- Juniors received information regarding college letters of recommendation during homeroom last week.
- Priority will be given to those students who make their requests between May 15 and June 1.
- Students must complete certain Family Connections Forms prior to requesting letters. (editor's note parents these are good documents for you to review before they are submitted, as students sometimes forget about an activity or two.) Teachers and counselors will use these documents when writing recommendations.

Guatemala Club Fundraiser for Los Hogares Orphanage Project - April 26 to May 12

An Alterra Coffee Sale will be held April 26 to May 12 to raise funds to paint the Los Hogares Orphanage in Guatemala. A group of SHS students will be traveling to Guatemala in June and will be painting the orphanage as a service project. Money raised from the sale will be used to purchase paint and other supplies needed to complete the project. The group will need to raise \$3,500 to paint all the orphanage buildings.
