SHS Students Excel at State Solo & Ensemble Festival

SHS students excelled at the day long State Solo & Ensemble Festival, at UWM, on Saturday, April 29. See below for some impressive results.

Theft

Please remind your student to keep their belongings locked – to utilize their gym and hall lockers and to lock their bikes. (Personal experience indicates that the U-Shaped locks with keys are the best kind for bikes). Please discuss with your child the steps he/she should take if they do become a victim of theft. From Mr. Harris:

If a student learns that he/she has been victimized by theft, the theft should be reported immediately to the classroom teacher. The student then should come immediately to the Assistant Principal's office to file a theft report. It is important that this is done as close to the realization of the theft as it provides school administration/SRO the best chance of recovering stolen items. The report should be filled out with as much detail as possible.

A theft that occurs after school should be reported to a coach or available teacher if possible. I suggest the student then reports the theft to the Shorewood Police Department. Upon arriving to school the next day, the student should file a theft report in the Assistant Principal's office.

Attendance Policy – Unexcused Absences

Spring is a good time of year to review the SHS attendance policy. Please note, that in past years, some parents and students have been surprised to learn the specific rules, and disappointed to learn that an exam exemption opportunity had been forfeited. Please read the policy carefully to learn what types absences are excused, what procedures are required to have an absence be excused, and how parents will be informed of any unverified absences. Summer Athletic Opportunities from the Recreation Department

The Shorewood Recreation Department will be offering the following this summer

- Fastpitch (Girls) Softball teams that will play at least 15 games both in Shorewood and in around the North Shore. Practices will begin mid to late may and the season will go until the end of July. (Ages 10-14) Also, there is a Fastpitch Clinic for grades 3-8.
- Youth Basketball Summer League for grades 5-9. Starting this summer, the Shorewood Basketball Association (SBA) will be under the supervision of the Shorewood Recreation Department. These summer basketball leagues are being run as a feeder program to further prepare our youth for basketball when entering high school. Depending on enrollment, we may need to hold evaluation practices to determine player skill level and what basketball league or setting is most appropriate for each participant.
