Recent Graduate Selected to USAV All Tournament Team!

Congratulations to Adam Kessenich who was selected as a member of USA Volleyball's 18-year-old Boys All-Tournament Team at the 2012 USAV Boys Junior National Championships. Kessenich's team, the West Allis Lightning B18, captured the National Championship title by defeating Southern California Volleyball Association 18-Quicksilver in three exciting sets, 25-27, 25-22, 15-10.

The USAV All-Tournament Team is a prestigious honor recognizing the top athletes of the tournament in each age group. Kessenich was recognized as the elite "libero" of the Championships - a player specializing in defensive skills. Characteristics of a libero include quick feet, great passing, leadership, and an aggressive defender - he must be willing to do whatever it takes to keep the ball in play. As a former standout libero for the SHS Greyhounds under Coach Kevin Gemignani, Kessenich will play volleyball for St. Ambrose University in Davenport, IA this fall.

Registration Information – from a Parent's Perspective

SHS Registration is on August 9 and 10 this year from 8 am – noon each day. During registration, your child will receive their class schedule & have their yearbook/I.D. photo taken (seniors – I.D. only – <u>senior photos are submitted separately</u>) and you will pay your child's school fees, etc. This will be my 8th year registering a child at SHS. I know some of you have

done it many more times than that, but for others of you this is new, so let me give you some hints from a parent's perspective. (These are just hints as to how to best navigate registration; for details as to what happens at registration, what fees are required, etc. see the <u>summer newsletter</u> that was mailed home from school this week.)

- New This Year Due to numerous requests, we will include email addresses for parents who opt to have theirs
 included in this year's directory. There will be a station for you to stop at to confirm that your directory data is correct
 and that we are only publishing information that you want to have published. On that form, you will be able to give us
 permission to include your email address in the directory if you so choose. (Note that our intent is to share parent
 email addresses students don't use them.) Please do NOT skip this registration station.
- Plan your timing wisely. The administration is not kidding when they say that the first part of the first day is typically the busiest time. If you were to drive by the SHS Arena at 7:45 am on the first day of registration you might wonder if Aaron Rodgers or Donald Driver is inside signing autographs as the line to enter can be snaking through the parking lot. (I've never arrived early enough to figure out how early the line starts forming but either it's very early or a TON of people arrive between 7:40 and 7:50, as that's when I usually arrive to work at the parent association table.) But when the very efficient staff opens the doors at 8 AM, they are starting with quite a logjam. I've seen people who register on the first morning wait an hour just to get to the first station.

Now here's a caveat to the above – we've been telling people this for the last couple of years, and it turns out that you've listened. So last year the line wasn't quite as long at 8:00 am as it had been previously, but it was still long. Maybe not Aaron Rogers long – maybe Charles Woodson long.

And here's where timing becomes a gamble – last year I wrote that the second half of the first day is typically slow – but you listened so well that the line at 10:30 am on day one was quite long last year. So, I can't really predict crowd control. Just know that there are busy times and slow times. So far, the second half of day two has always been really slow – but as soon as I write that, it may change.

- Bring your checkbook. You will need separate checks for your registration fees, yearbook order, Ripples subscriptions, student directory orders, school photo orders and no doubt some other things I've forgotten. Of course, cash is acceptable too, and if I recall correctly, credit cards are accepted for at least some of the above items, but definitely not all. Many of the items are optional purchases, but be prepared with enough checks so that you can pay for what you both need and want to purchase.
- Read the School Mailing. If you haven't already, you should soon receive a <u>mailing from school</u> review it for the details as what you can expect at registration **including specific fees**. (And read all the other info too –it is loaded with good stuff registration info, calendar info, first day info etc. etc. etc.) Recall, this here document, is just some hints from a parent for the details as to what really happens at registration you'll need to read the official document from school!
- A plug for Ripples. There are usually Ripples staff members on hand selling home delivery subscriptions to the SHS Student Newspaper. From my perspective, Ripples is the best news in town. You can attempt to rely on your student to share his/her copy with you, but I encourage you to consider supporting Ripples by purchasing a home delivery subscription. The fee is usually quite reasonable, and our student journalists do a great job of sharing both community and school news – including many items that you won't always hear about from your child.
- Save Time at Registration Do Some of the Paperwork Ahead of Time
 - **The directory order form** can be <u>downloaded here</u>. Bring it and and your check with you to registration. (Remember this is the Parent Associations ONLY fundraiser of the year!)
 - **Picture order forms** were included with the summer mailing from school complete it and write your check ahead of time.
 - There will be other forms to complete and checks to write once you get there, but I recommend doing what you can ahead of time.
- Keep a Copy of Your Child's Schedule for Yourself. This will come in quite handy when you attend Parent Open House on September 20 – as classrooms are much easier to find if you know the room numbers! (And by the second week of school, your child will most likely have long forgotten room numbers – so they won't be as much help as you

might expect.) I also find it handy to have the schedule on hand during the school year, for the times when I need to make an emergency orthodontist appointment, etc.

Fall Athletic Registration

Details about fall athletic registration will be provided in the school mailing. Please note that all athletes must have a physical card on file before they will be permitted to participate. If your child still needs their physical, schedule their appointment soon!

Physicals performed before April 1 of any year are good for the remainder of that school year and the following school year. Physicals performed after April 1 of any year are good for the remainder of that school year and the following 2 school years. Each athlete must submit an athletic physical card each year – either a physical card or an alternate year physical card.

Please know that students will receive their class schedules upon paying school fees at the registration event.

Every year a few parents ask why the high school does not hold registration hours in the evening in addition to the morning hours. While I understand the inconvenience that this might cause some parents, it is worth noting that high school registration – compared to elementary and intermediate school registration - is a complicated process. Registration at the high school requires about 20 people to work the event. Some are paid and others volunteer. Just like it is challenging to make it to registration during the "regular work day," it is also challenging to get that many workers trained and available to work the event outside of the "regular work day." While we would much prefer that people register during our registration event, our office staff will work with families to register all the way into the start of the school year. That being said, the company that takes yearbook pictures, the booster club, the students involved in selling the yearbook, etc. will only be available during our posted registration event.

School Supplies

Another Mini Note from the Editor – It's about this time of year that my phone usually starts ringing with new SHS parents asking about school supplies. After years of being handed a supply list each summer, it's a bit of an adjustment to not have one. Since students take a wide range of classes at SHS, there is not a "one size fits all" supply list. Rather, you can safely assume that your child will need paper and writing utensils. Some studnets prefer spiral notebooks, others prefer loose leaf and binders or folders. They won't need crayons or markers or glue – well maybe they will later – but they'll need them as projects are assigned – not to store at school all year. Some teachers have specific requirements – so don't buy everything right away – but in my experience, most teachers are somewhat flexible. The math calculator is one item you will want to be sure they have. The summer mailing (look for it in July) usually is quite clear on which calculator is needed (often the same one they used in 8th grade). If you need to purchase a calculator, keep your eyes open for sales and rebates, which can significantly reduce the cost. ~ Debbie
