Juniors & Seniors - Sign Up to Meet with College Representatives

Junior and Senior Students are welcome to meet with college representatives that visit SHS. To do so, students must obtain a pass from the Student Support Services Office at least 24 hours in advance. These visits are an opportunity for students to learn more about a specific school, and also an opportunity to show "demonstrated interest" in a school, something which some (not all) schools consider in the admissions process.

Congratulations, Kudos & Thank You's

Prajwal Giri & Atish KC honored for Tutoring Bhutanese Refugee Children

This summer, Prajwal Giri and Atish KC, SHS students tutored Bhutanese children who had been born and raised in refugee camps in Nepal before coming to Milwaukee. Sadly, little or no educational opportunities had existed in the camps. Last year, the students met in the MPS New Comers Center, but due to MPS budget cuts, were unable to continue during the summer. The summer program was then taken over by the UWM Center for Urban Community Devlopment. Originally students met in small, damp basement, and later the North Shore Presbytarian Church was secured to hold the Children's language and cultural program.

The following is an excerpt from a very touching note sent from Lloyd Hansen, renowned SHS substitute teacher, to Matt Joynt, SHS Principal. Lloyd presented awards to Prajwal and Atish during a ceremony recognizing their efforts.

This summer Dr. Devarati Syam and Dr. Kalyani Rai of the UWM Outreach and Continuing Education Department organized the Nepali School Shorewood. This effort was to tutor Bhutanese refugee children in Shorewood and other metro communities. These children had spent from two to eight years in refugee camps in Nepal before coming to our community. Sadly, no educational opportunities actually existed in the camps. Originally, the students met in someone's rather damp basement. My neighbor, Bob Heffernan, arranged for the classes to meet in the North Shore Presbyterian Church.

SHS Students, Prajwal Giri and Atish KC tutored immigrant students in their native Nepalese in math and English two hours per day, three days a week. At the ceremony both were highly praised for their patience and dedication. I wish you could have seen the wonderful smiles on all faces present. UWM, as part of the out-reach program, did pay the young men a stipend. Here is where I personally get misty-eyed. Atish and Prajwal donated all of their salaries to the Bhutanese Refugee Relief Fund. Seriously, does it get any better than this? ~ Lloyd
