From SAFE - School District Annual Meeting September 27 - 7PM SHS Library

The School District of Shorewood will be holding their annual meeting on September 27. At this meeting, community members IN ATTENDANCE have the right to vote on the District Budget for the 2011-2012 school year. This means that if 5 community members attend the meeting – those 5 have ALL the say in our district's budget this year – meaning that it is possible for a very small minority of people to make major changes to what the "community" actually wants. This is legally binding – so it is important that a representative sample of the community attend. Other districts have seen small groups of people make or attempt to make major changes to budgets that had been crafted with community input months ago. If you care about the budget, please attend this meeting so that your voice can be counted.

 - Expect this to be updated frequently as more colleges schedule visits to SHS
 - Learn more about Family Connections at the Student Support Services Presentation at the conclusion of Open House.
 - Attending these sessions, not only allows a student to learn more about a specific college, it also allows them to show "demonstrated interest" in that college – something that some (not all) schools consider in the admissions process.
