Hello Families,

I am writing on behalf of the SEED Foundation. Some of you may be very familiar with our organization. For those unfamiliar, in a nutshell, we are a grassroots org. whose goal is to raise money for Shorewood schools through donations and then give all the money back to the District for use in the classroom. Since the beginning roughly \$700,000 has been raised and donated. This year SEED has given grants to buy new Chemistry Lab equipment for the HS and outfit a new computer lab with over 25 new MACs among other things.

I AM NOT ASKING FOR A MONETARY DONATION (at this time). Instead I am asking for 2 hours on July 9 if you can spare them. I know summer is crazy busy and it's hard to fit in any time to spend as a whole family. SEED needs volunteers to grill, serve and cashier at the picnic. Almost anyone is eligible to help, though I would dissuade youngers from grilling. By having smiling, happy people manning the SEED food area alumni will have a warm and happy feeling when they think of SEED and perhaps might think favorably of us when the Fall Campaign rolls around. You may serve a hot dog to a future SEED donor who just might feel compelled to give back to the school s/he so fondly loved back in the old days, or not so long ago....
